

Municipal elections will be taking place across the Parish of the Valley on or before Monday, October 24th. Elections provide us with an important opportunity to consider the role of our faith within the public sphere, and to live-into the commitments of our baptismal covenant within our wider community. As part of our journey of Truth and Reconciliation, The Parish of the Valley will be hosting the *Mapping the Ground We Stand On* workshop on Saturday, 26 November, from 1-4pm at St. John the Evangelist Eganville. PWRDF has developed this interactive educational experience which explores:

- Indigenous presence on the map of Turtle Island/Canada;
- The history of Settler arrival, and their relationship to one another; and
- The concepts of Terra Nullius (empty land) and the Doctrine of Discovery.

This is a wonderful opportunity to listen, learn, and engage in both the personal and collective journey toward a just, respectful and healing relationship between Indigenous Peoples and Settlers.
